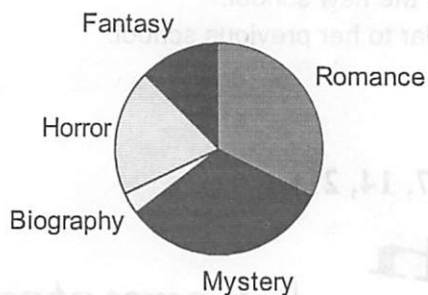

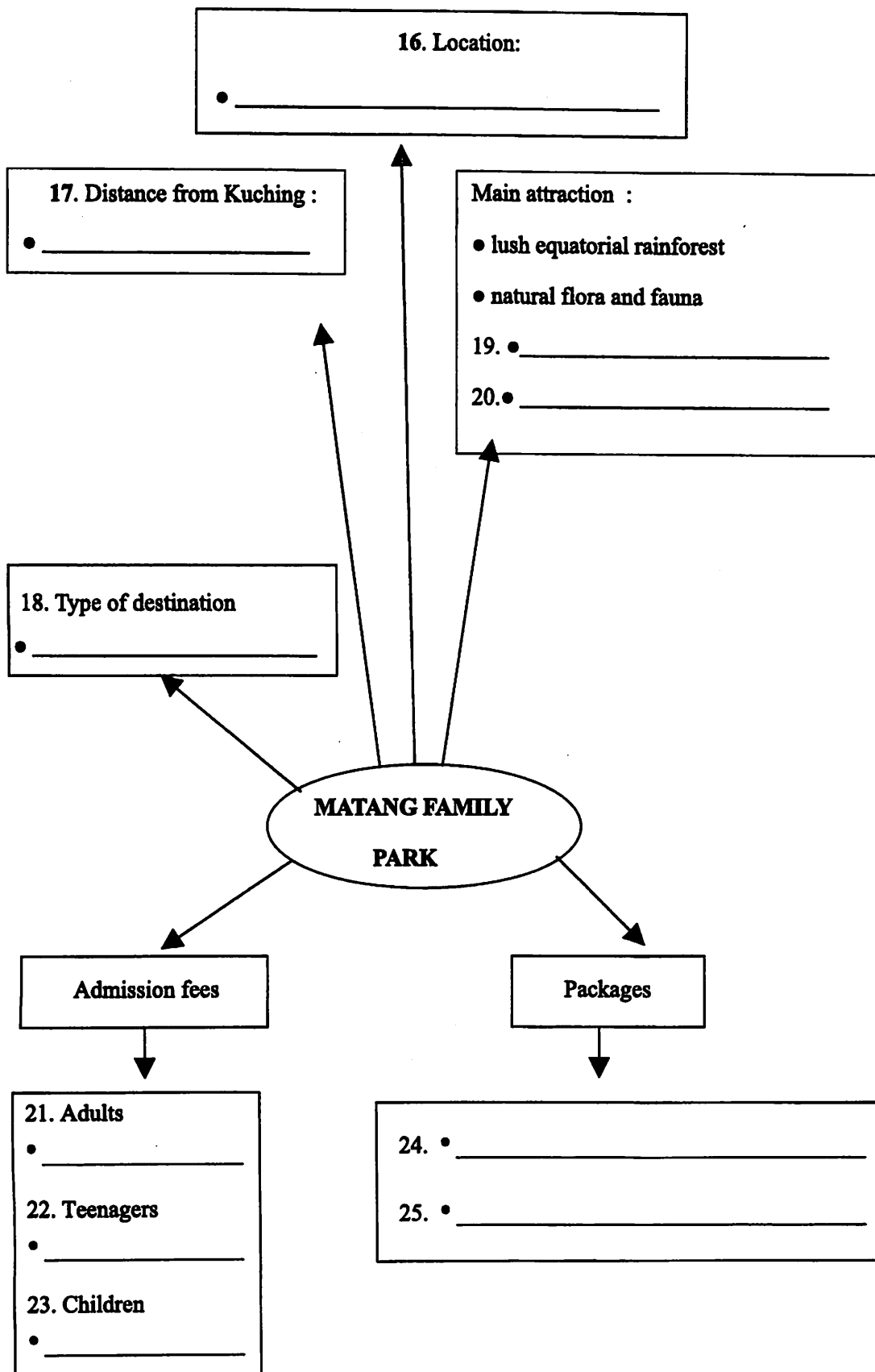

2	<p>College students have always had study distractions, from video games, to parties, to the cute girl in the front row. But Facebook really takes distraction to a new level. Bored college students can spend hours reading their friends' updates, looking at pictures, playing Farmville and doing all kinds of things other than their homework. And thanks to mobile devices and laptops, the Facebook distraction can go anywhere a student can go. If students are not careful, they may run the risk of increasing procrastination which may easily evolve into addiction. It could hamper a student's educational obligations which explain as to why most educational institutes and organizations have banned the use of Facebook in their premises.</p>	10
3	<p>College students have always been fighting about who's dating who and who's kissing who, but previously, this generally stayed within groups of friends and dorm room floors. Today, angry students can vent drama to the world before common sense sinks in and prevents them from hitting "share." This may lead to over-dependency on Facebook for social interaction which can adversely affect their social communication skills and the value of relationships, mostly long distance relationships. This is because the relationship is built and maintained through a website that lacks the emotional and physical involvement of an unadulterated relationship.</p>	15

Now that parents, professors, future employers and just about everyone else is on Facebook, it isn't really private anymore. It can be tempting to post incriminating photos, obnoxious status updates and other things that shouldn't be viewed by one's 1,245 friends. The issue of privacy comes to the fire with all these information sharing. Everything is available to everyone else so there is no protection of privacy. Their privacy can be infringed and personal information can be misused.</p>	25
6	<p>On the other hand, Facebook is a fantastic social networking tool, and can be used to help students communicate with each other about all kinds of things. Fell asleep in history class and need someone's notes? Need a ride home for the weekend? Wondering where the party is? Moreover, since many professors are on Facebook too, this may be a good place to ask a quick question about an assignment.</p>	
7	<p>Since many college students are away from home, Facebook provides students the opportunity to stay in touch. Physical distance is now a setback of the past. Students who are homesick can keep in touch with family members and friends back home, and students who are in long distance relationships can have an easier time feeling connected.</p>	35
	<p>As for the issue that students are tuning out more serious issues to hang out on Facebook, there's the matter of political organizations and other groups that have a Facebook presence. Students who want to get involved, or who want to learn more about them, may be able to find information and a network of like-minded people on Facebook. Perhaps even more importantly, Facebook can continue to serve as a networking resource after college, when the time comes to look for a job.
