Questions 33 – 47

Read the passage below and answer the questions that follow.

- 1 The disruption of public transport was one of the main aims of the communists. To accomplish this they tried to lower the morale and the loyalty of the transport workers. They also made attempts to set fire to the vehicles belonging to the bus companies.
- 2 A typical case of attempted arson occurred in July 1952, when, at a regular stop, two communists threw burning petrol-soaked rags into a bus. Fortunately the conductor managed to put out the flames before any serious damage was caused. At the time the driver, Hassan, had the courage to chase one of the arsonists. Although Hassan pursued this criminal for a considerable distance he was unable to catch him, but he, nevertheless, gave the police a useful description of the man. Because of this voluntary co-operation with the authorities, Hassan became a marked man – ripe for 'elimination'. His conductor was also a future target. 5 10
- 3 On November 19th, so long after the event that both men had almost forgotten it, they were on a night duty which took them through the main streets of Chinatown. They had travelled this route often, and on this evening the bus rolled competently from stop to stop among the noises and lights of the crowded streets. At 7.50 p.m. Hassan drew up to a bus stop on Allison Road, opposite a prominent government building. By the light of his headlights and the streetlights, Hassan noticed several men standing quite near the bus stop. One of these men darted quickly across the front of his bus and stepped up to the window of his cab, several feet above the road. This man held a pistol. Without warning he fired four shots at Hassan in succession, shattering the glass windows of his cab. Hit by the first shot Hassan tried in vain to get out of his seat, but three following shots from almost point-blank range left him slumped over the steering wheel in agony. But despite the close range only two of the bullets found their mark: one had passed through his shoulder and the other had lodged in his stomach. The pain from these wounds made it impossible for Hassan to climb down from his cab. 15 20 25
- 4 The loud pistol shots had been clearly heard by the passengers and the conductor. With cries of fear the men and women quickly ran from the bus, gathering in confusion on the footway. The conductor followed the passengers, running at once around the front of the bus where he saw Hassan collapsed over the large steering wheel and groaning in pain. 30
- 5 The conductor stepped bravely into the road, stopped a passing car, and asked for the police. After only a few minutes a police radio car arrived. The corporal from this car climbed up to Hassan's cab, asking if he could speak. Between groans Hassan managed to say he had been shot by a man wearing a white shirt and white trousers; having said this, Hassan lapsed into unconsciousness. Summoned by the police car, an ambulance took Hassan to hospital where an immediate operation was performed. 35
- 6 In hospital Hassan's operation lasted more than two hours. Bullet wounds in the stomach are often fatal, and it was entirely due to the fast and skilful surgery that Hassan's life was saved. In the course of this operation the doctors removed the bullet from Hassan's stomach. This, together with the four cartridge cases found at 40

the scene of the shooting was examined by ballistics experts. The bullet had been fired from the same gun that had earlier been used to kill a millionaire and the foreman of a tin factory: and which was to be used against several other people in the future. 45

7 The communists had attempted to murder Hassan because he chased a man who had tried to set fire to his bus. It was obvious that this attack had been very carefully planned. In fact the movements of Hassan's bus must have been studied with 'inside' information from other workers. The communists were aware of the exact time and place where Hassan would make an easy target. 50

8 Happily Hassan made a complete recovery and returned to his job working with the same conductor. In doing this he showed great courage – because no one was more vulnerable than an unarmed bus driver forced to make scheduled stops at well-marked bus stops. 55
