	Spelling – frequent errors. Paragraphs – ignorant of rules. Paragraphs – haphazardly arranged, may be absent. Task fulfilment – limited subject matter or partially treated. Interest is not aroused.
Uii 8-13	Language – MULTIPLE WORD errors predominate, re-reading is necessary. Sentences – only a few accurate sentences, however simple. Sense – content may be comprehensible but high frequency of errors distorts meaning. Task fulfilment – script may be far short of required length.
Uiii 0-7	Sense/task fulfilment – almost entirely impossible to read. Make little or no sense.
